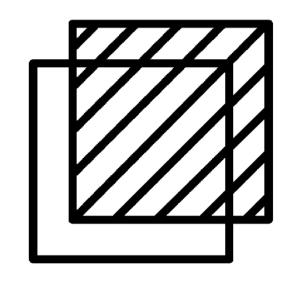


## Here are some of the great benefits of Shopify Link:

Creating the Matching System

- Questionnaire
- Determining fields (product quantity, quality, shipping time)



Attracting
Supplier Network

- Initial data scraping to create base
- Outreaching



Supplier Quality

- Customer driven reviews
- Decreased merchant risk

### Some key points in our implementation plan:

- Analyse target customers, figure out their pains, gains, and determine value proposition
- Analyse competitive space extract competitor features and their value proposition
- Determine product market fit; create requirements, benchmarks, and feature roadmap based on ease of implimentation and impact
- Design UI, iterate with user testing
- Build back-end and front-end
- Iterate with MVPs (minimal viable products) to validate assumptions
- Initiate web scraping and onboarding of producer information
- Full product release

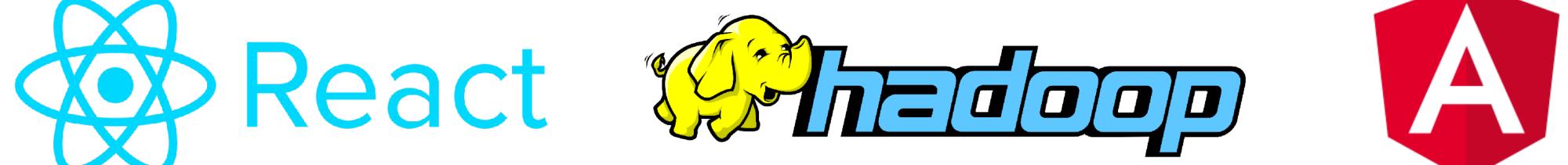

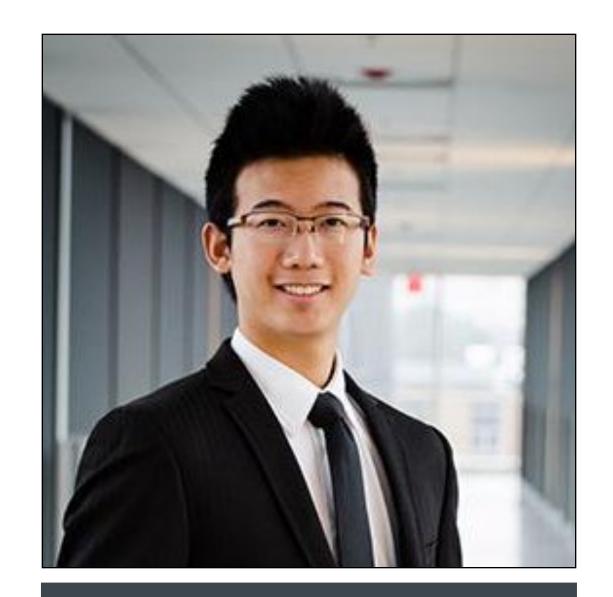

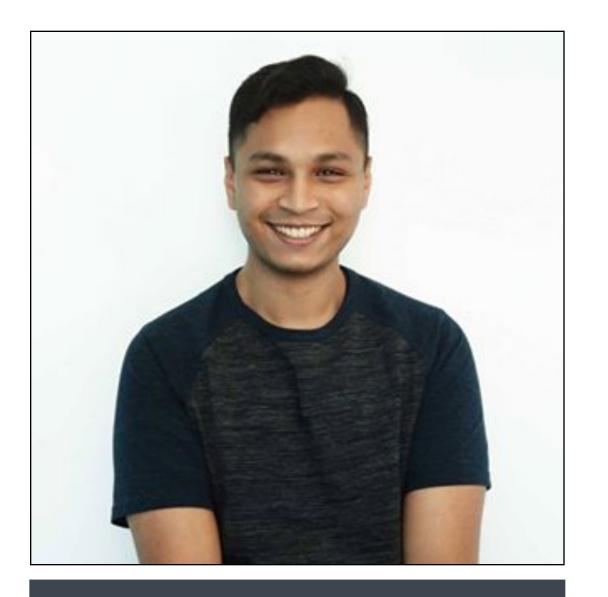

### Alibaba Comparison (Shopify Link vs. Alibaba)





#### Advantages

- Step-by-step procurement discovery
- Integration with Shopify platform
- Matching process

- Vast supplier network
- Dominance in Chinese and greater
   Asia network

### Disadvantages

- Supplier network will not be as extensive as Alibaba
- Confusing/inconsistent information
- Allegations of poor or illegal suppliers

### Service Agreement Components

Typical components of standardized service agreements include:

- Quantity
- Payment Terms
- Pricing/Credit Terms
- Scheduling
- Cancellation Policies
- Inventory Management Policies
- Transportation Method
- Warranty/Quality Policies
- I.P. Rights and Security Policies

### Cost Structure

\*non-exhaustive cost structure - based on sources from Glassdoor and personal estimates

#### Timeline:

- 1/2 month design UI
- 1/2 month user tests to finalize UX/UI
- 4 months back-end system
- 3 months front-end system
- 1 month testing, fixed and revisions

### Designer Hiring:

- 2 designers for 1 month
- 6 back-end developers for 4 months
- 4 front-end developers for 3 months

Total Cost - \$~300K

Yearly Costs

Designers - \$53K

Back-end Developers - \$110K

Front-end Developers - \$50K
